

AiDa sets high expectations for Mentor Leaders (MLs), and Mentor Leaders in Training (MLTs) aiming for them to embody positive role models. They should display enthusiasm, passion for the arts, and enjoy working with children. MLs are expected to mediate conflicts, encourage team play, and demonstrate mindfulness, cooperation, inclusivity, kindness, empathy, and compassion towards others.

Key expectations for AiDa Mentor Leaders include:

1. ****Positive Attitude:** ** Display positivity, encouragement, and passion for the arts.
2. ****Conflict Mediation:** ** Ability to mediate conflicts and encourage teamwork.
3. ****Behavioral Role Modeling:** ** Act as role models, showcasing appropriate language, attitude, and behavior.
4. ****Commitment:** ** Demonstrate commitment through attendance and dedication to making a difference in a safe, inclusive environment.
5. ****Inclusivity:** ** Foster inclusivity, cooperation, and empathy among participants.
6. ****Leadership Skills:** ** Develop and display leadership qualities, improving communication and organizational skills.
7. ****Creativity:** ** Inspire creativity through mindfulness, self-expression, and acting styles.
8. ****Community Focus:** ** Represent AiDa's vision and mission while focusing on community building and collaboration.

Adhering to these expectations allows Mentor Leaders to create a nurturing environment where participants can learn, grow, and thrive.

AiDa is a community partner offering year-round programming and opportunities for CO-OP Summer Placement and as a youth volunteer to earn the required 40 hours of Community Service Credit for students entering Grade 9.

AiDa's Mentor Leader's in Training is for ages 13 in Grade 8 to prepare to become a Mentor Leader. It is a bridge between camper/student and Mentor Leader. They received 50% off regular class or camp fees.
